This National Progression Award (NPA) develops knowledge and understanding in Photography.

It covers areas such as:

- understanding different photography genres and concepts
- · practical skills in photographing people and places
- organising and working with photographic images

You will be required to use either a school camera or your mobile phone camera.

There will be no written exam or critical work required to complete this level 5 NPA. The evaluations of your photographs are integrated into your digital folio - this is sufficient evidence.

What will I study?

There are three separate units:

- 1. Understanding photography (starting with still life objects and themes to grasp basics)
- 2. Photographing people (using props and drama equipment)
- 3. Photographing places (accessible locations in Dingwall area)

To pass the NPA, you must successfully meet the criteria in each unit's checklist given to you by your teacher.

How will I be assessed?

This is a unit only and so there will be no final exam. If you successfully achieve all of the requirements of the unit you will be awarded a 'pass' and not an A, B, C etc.

All parts of the unit will be assessed by the Art Department staff and will verified by SQA.

What skills will I develop?

- You will develop skills in editing photographs using digital software.
- The NPA can help you to develop self-confidence, skills in working with others, problem solving skills and the ability to use ICT which should be useful for further study or employment in several different areas.
